I feel honored to have an opportunity to write to you in the space usually reserved for the Rector. Cathy used this space to share with us her reflections on her spiritual journey as well as our shared journey as a church. I would like to use this space to do the same.

Cathy's departure has certainly been a jolt to us all. However, together we have proven it is not a crisis. If you have noticed, Sunday services and the celebration of the Eucharist, the representation of the sacrifice and the Resurrection of Christ, the core of our faith, has continued. We have celebrated the end of Advent, the birth of our Lord, and the beginning of Epiphany just as we always have in the past.

We have shared fellowship during coffee hour, in small groups, and during the Epiphany Feast. We have celebrated the life and said farewell to a wonderful and cherished member of our church with a funeral that honored her memory.

The Vestry has continued to meet its obligations. It passed a 2014 budget and has met with the Canon to become educated about our options and next steps for clergy leadership. The bills are getting paid, offerings are getting credited, and pastoral needs are being cared for. We are planning for mission and ministry like we always have because that is who we are as a church. Surely God expects this of us.

Yet, I'm sure that a degree of uncertainty and some anxiety remains among many people in our parish. I must admit the first few weeks after Cathy announced her departure, I suffered persistent anxiety and sleepless nights. That additional stress made the pain from my car accident almost unbearable, (just when I was feeling better too).

But it is natural. Books and articles have been written to help churches in transition. If you do a search, you will discover websites and organizations dedicated to this topic. Even the Episcopal Diocese of Newark has many on-line resources which are available to anyone, and copies of which have been provided to Vestry.

But since those early weeks, I have gained a renewed strength and confidence in our direction, process and perseverance (even my neck feels better). What has made me more positive? Well, it's been all of **YOU**. Bit by bit over the past several weeks I have seen individuals and groups pull together in order to remain committed to who we are, what have started and what we are called to do. It has been amazing to watch, and the leadership is still emerging as people step-in to fill voids.

This is not to say we will not be challenged in nearly every way possible in the upcoming months. As we begin our discernment process to identify, together as a church, a priest who we hope to call (and who will be called to us) while striving to fulfill our mission and ministry, we will no doubt be challenged. But to be honest, as Christians we are challenged daily; it is what God expects of us and what defines us.

The Wardens and Vestry are committed to doing the best we can to be transparent and communicate updates and news. We are not experts. Many of us have jobs, family commitments, outside interest and obligations just like you but we are committed to do our best with diligence, hard work and faith.

From Your Vestry...

Finding the Next Priest

A few Sundays ago the Canon of the Diocese of Newark, The Rev. Canon Gregory A. Jacobs, came to speak to St. James' Vestry regarding the process of replacing our rector. There are several stages that a congregation has to go through in order to determine who will be placed in a particular parish. This process is known as discernment; as filling a rector's position is not like replacing an employee, it involves something much deeper. It requires discernment. The first step in discernment involves the vestry arranging for a supply priest, a priest who temporarily takes care of services and any pastoral duties or special services while more permanent arrangements are made.

The next step would be initial ministry discernment which involves identifying short term goals and priorities of the church. This stage is necessary so that the vestry can, with the help of the congregation, be more specific about what is required of a new priest. This stage makes the diocese aware of what the parish is looking for in a priest so that an appropriate appointment can be made and an interim priest or priest-in-charge can be appointed by the Bishop. The third step would be the discernment of clergy ministry during the transition. At this stage the Bishop appoints a priest to help the congregation through the transition from old priest to a new permanent priest.

Congregations have two options when it comes to priests during the transition period. They can have an interim priest or a priest-in-charge. An interim priest is an agent of change but does not work to be disruptive or solve any existing problems. The interim priest maintains the status quo. An interim priest cannot become the permanent priest of the parish. This would be the ideal transition clergy for a parish that is vital and financially stable, with very little conflict. A priest-in-charge is a priest that comes into a parish that has significant issues that need to be resolved. Such a priest will provide leadership and guidance and works with the vestry to confront major issues facing the congregation. The priest-in-charge can be an option for permanent priest of the parish he/she is serving. Both options are appointments by the Bishop but require the vestry and congregation providing adequate information as a guide to the appropriate appointment. An interim priest is usually an appointment of between 12 and 18 months while the priest-in-charge is a longer term appointment that can last up to 3 years.

The Canon was very informative and understanding of the fact that this transition and discernment process can be overwhelming, but there are systems in place that help bring the process to a suitable conclusion. We are thankful to the Diocese for all their help. The vestry asks that the congregation come forward with their concerns and suggestions as we are all in this together. For us to get the next priest we need input from everyone. As we continue our search we pray for earthly and heavenly help.

Invitation to Join Transition Team

As we are all learning, transition is an important time in the life of a parish. It can be a time of anxiety, uncertainty and opportunity. Ensuring the good health of the parish and clergy, so that this time is life-giving and positive, is important. The Vestry is therefore seeking 4-8 persons who may want to serve as members of a "Transition Team" who would facilitate good communications among members of the church.

The Transition Team who would serve exclusively during this time of transition. The Transition Team is not the Search Committee (this will be formed after the church's self-study process). Instead, the Transition Team will make themselves available to listen to concerns expressed by members of the church and serve as a calming empathetic voice. The Transition Team will help enhance and enable communications that encourage conversations and reach out to those who may have moved toward the margins or become disenfranchised. Through their listening, they serve to sense what needs need to be addressed during the transition phase and channel this vital information back to the Vestry. The Transition Team may also work with the Search Committee in the gathering of self-study information.

They may also assist the new rector and their family to become oriented to the community. A member of the Vestry may serve on the Team or a member of the Team will attend Vestry meetings to report on their work.
