#### Celebrating the Rev. Dr. Franklin E Vilas

#### 1 Corinthians 3: 6-8

"I have planted. Apollos watered; but God gave the increase."

Have you ever worked on the preliminary stage of a new idea...at school, on the job, in any committee or other group? You brain storm, debate the pros and cons, work hard grinding out all the details and slowly things begin to come together. And then...for unknown reason, you have to move on.....change jobs or relocate and you never really know how everything turned out.

Our long-term supply priest, Fr. "Skip" Vilas, has had just such an experience but with a positive ending. During a recent interview with Fr. Skip, he explained to me that although he has always considered himself a parish priest, he felt called to be engaged in major issues. While serving as rector of Trinity Wall Street in NYC in the 1970s, Fr Skip became convinced of the role of religious communities in the field of mental health. His activism in this area brought him to the attention of Rosalyn Carter, and he served for one year on the President's Commission on Mental Health. This commission studied the de-institutionalization of the mentally ill that was occurring at that time and predicted that without government help, there would be an increase in homelessness among the mentally ill.

Fr Skip...not being one to stand and just let things happen...worked locally in his neighborhood of Brooklyn to secure grants that provided 20 apartments scattered throughout the borough to provide housing for the homeless and mentally ill. But then Fr. Skip was called to a church in Connecticut. He always wondered whatever happened to this little attempt to relieve the suffering of the homeless.

The grants that made those 20 apartments possible grew into a multi-million dollar organization, Brooklyn

Community Housing and Services, that provides safe and clean and supportive housing for more than 1,000 homeless men, women, and children every year! Founded in 1978, BCHS provides short-term, transitional, and permanent housing, homelessness prevention, vocational training, substance abuse counseling, mental health care, and other vital services. Its unique program model has been studied by government and nonprofits throughout the US, the UK, and Australia.

BCHS will hold a 40th anniversary gala in May 2019. In recognition of Fr Skip's accomplishment so many years ago, the Board of Directors of BCHS persevered in their efforts to locate him and have extended an invitation to attend the celebration. Well done Fr Skip!


